

Power Assist

Course Description

Transitioning from a manual to a powered wheelchair can have significant impacts on resources and function. With more and more power assist options on the market these are becoming popular options both as primary mobility devices or to provide occasional assistance to mobilisation in certain environments.

Products range from systems that amplify current functional mobilisation to small motors that operate via a joystick like a powered mobility base.

What are the types of power assist options available on the market?
